Name of Project: Trail of 100 Giants Rehabilitation Project

Purpose and Need for Project:

There is a need to repair and/or replace the asphalt surface of the trail and repair other features (such as curbing) within the trail prism. Sloughing of the trail subgrade has undermined the downslope edge of the asphalt pavement along some sections. The trail is approximately 1.2 miles long.

Proposed Action:

The proposed action will remove existing asphalt where needed using a small excavator and hand tools. Asphalt removed from trail will be removed from the site. New asphalt will be applied using a small asphalt machine where needed. Repairs to the existing curb or new curbing will be conducted with small equipment or with hand tools. Where sloughing of the trail subgrade has undermined the downslope edge of the asphalt pavement, repair of the subgrade will be conducted using earth fill or rock retaining walls prior to asphalt repair work. After asphalt pavement repairs are complete, a seal coat will be applied to the entire trail. The trail and access routes used for past projects will be used to transport equipment and materials.

Noise from the excavator and asphalt machines may cause disturbance to California spotted owl and/or northern goshawk, if present. Noise disturbance will be expected to cause temporary displacement of individuals for the duration of project activities. Displacement will have a negligible effect on individuals as they will be able to utilize nearby habitat during project activities and resume use of the project area after project completion. Disruption of breeding activities with possible decreased reproductive success of a spotted owl or goshawk breeding pair may also occur as a result of noise disturbance if the project activities are to occur during the breeding season (i.e., March 1-August 15 for California spotted owl and February 15-September 15 for northern goshawk). Implementation of limited operating periods for the duration of the breeding season would avoid impacts to breeding pairs. Surveys for these species can be conducted during the breeding status of the designated PACs and limited operating periods may be waived if surveys indicate that no breeding pairs are present.
